This seminar examines how terror-producing discourses are key to the authorising of a secular-liberal politics of time. It examines how the latter maintain its progressive and homogenizing function by collapsing and reordering nonsecular temporalities and the embodied practices that these contain.

Her research commitments emphasize the intellectual and political dimensions of contemporary Islam. She is specifically interested in the secularization of the Islamic discursive tradition and the implications for thinking about power, secularism, Muslim subjectivity and technologies of Islamic selfhood.
